We're proud to announce a historic milestone in the history of FCCRSNC – by the end of May we will hit the 20,000 mark of spay and neuter surgeries we've performed on dogs and cats since our clinic opened just five years ago!

To build on this success we kicked off a month-long fundraiser that started May 1. Our goal is to raise \$20,000 to help fund our next 20,000 surgeries. This will culmi-

nate June 3 when we celebrate the shelter's sixth birthday with a party in our facility's parking lot.

Board President Carol Mahoney says the shelter has come a long way in the past six years and believes the work we've done has had a significant impact in decreasing stray cat intake and euthanasia rates at the Larimer Humane Society. She says it's important to keep this momentum going.

"Having our clinic perform another 20,000 spays and overpopulation pet euthanasia rates in northern

Colorado," Carol said. "Our hard-working and dedicated clinic staff has done a tremendous service to the community by performing so many surgeries."

There are many ways you can help our clinic and shelter continue reducing pet overpopulation and making every pet a wanted pet, such as by donating to:

→ Maintenance and replacement of surgery-related equipment: Fully equipping a clinic such as ours would cost well over \$60,000 and we need to budget funds annually to cover mainte-

nance costs and equipment.

We sterilize about 600 cats and kittens annually at the shelter before adopting them out. At an average base cost of \$20 per surgery, that adds up to \$12,000 a year!

- ✓ Save a life! The average total cost to care for cats from admission to adoption is \$300. Donate \$300 to save the life of one cat that may not have "made it" at another shelter.
- → Become a Smitten With Kittens member to help ongoing operations. For this \$20K for 20K campaign, if you're already a member, consider increasing your level of support. All members receive recognition in our Whiskers 'n Wags Jubilee gala event program, on our website, and everyone gets some goodies.

Anonymous supporters matched the first \$1,000 in donations, helping us reach the \$2,000 mark in only four days!

FCCRSNC is a non-profit organization that relies heavily on the generosity of donors to keep our shelter and clinic up and running and to fund the outreach programs that help in our mission to improve the lives of pets and their owners.

"Monetary support from our donors is our main source of income; without our wonderful donors we wouldn't be able to save so many lives. Every penny counts," Carol said.







# Clinic sets new record for surgery totals

Spay Day and Beat the Heat promotions during February bring headcount to 483

One of our many goals at FCCRSNC is to educate the community about the importance of getting pets spayed and neutered. We want every pet to be a wanted pet and to reduce surrender and euthanasia rates in northern Colorado.

During the month of February, a combination of promotions and programs allowed for the spay and neuter of 483 dogs and cats, setting a clinic record for the number of surgeries in a single month.

Through an \$8,000 grant awarded by *PetSmart Charities*, our Beat the

Heat promotion helped to spay 200 female cats at a cost of only \$20 each for clients. Making this dent in cat reproduction should significantly help reduce the burden on shelters this spring and summer from dozens of litters of unwanted kittens.

Our annual World Spay Day event on Feb. 24 this year saw the addition of dogs to the normal lineup of cats, and 53 animals were sterilized.

And one of our most popular programs keeps getting bigger every year – the Prevent a Litter Plus (PAL+) program for low-income pet owners to get their pets spayed or neutered, vaccinated and microchipped free of charge. Pet owners have to demonstrate financial need either through proof of low income or documents showing they're receiving government assistance.

Last year saw the PAL+ program exceed our goal of getting 300 pets spayed and neutered. We are proud to announce that we sterilized 312 dogs and cats in 2011 and provided additional services to a total of 382 dogs and cats!

But we're just getting started – this year we expect to service over 500 pets through the PAL+ program, made possible by funding from several grants, including:

- **У** \$5,000 from ASPCA
- ⋄ \$3,000 from Foundation for the Protection of Animals
- ✓ \$2,500 from Build-A-Bear Workshop

PAL+ coordinator Judy Miotke said, "You wouldn't believe how many people still don't know about us. We just want people to know that if they need it, we're here to help them take care of their pets."
